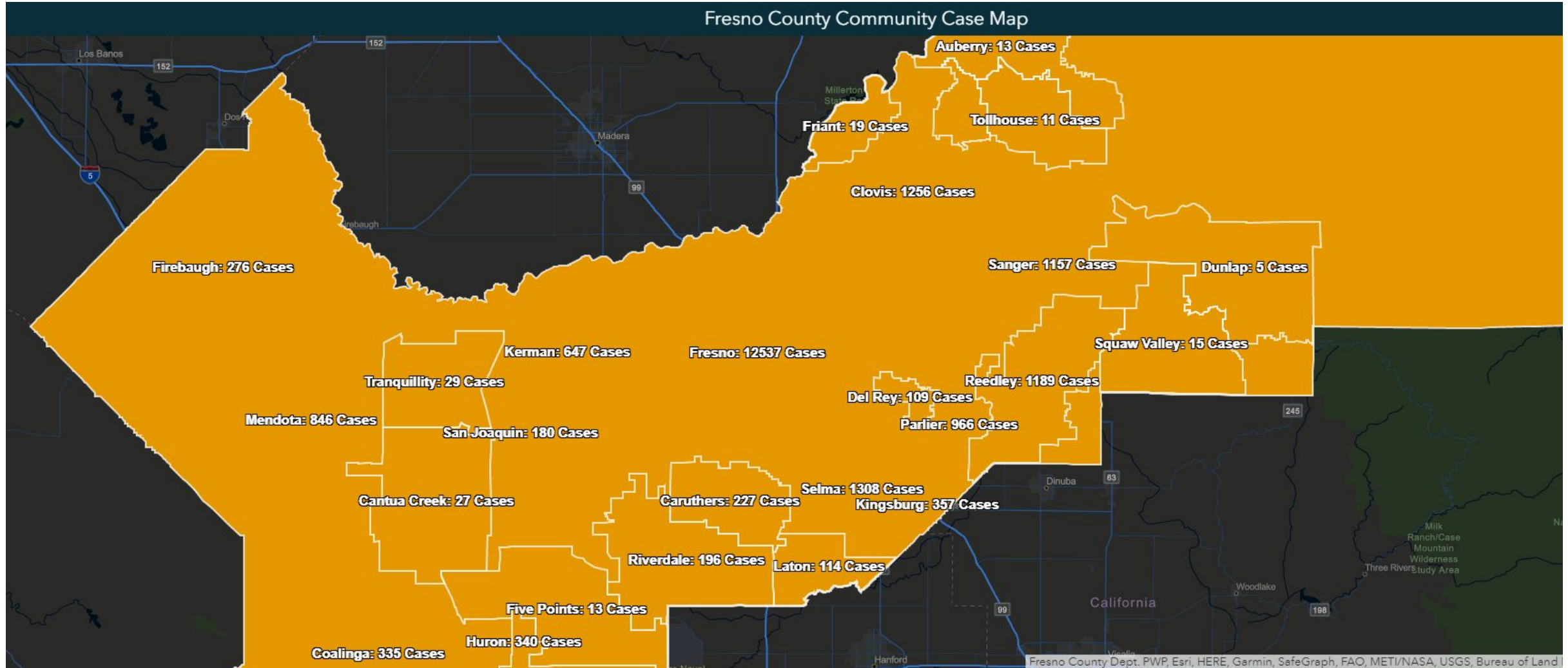

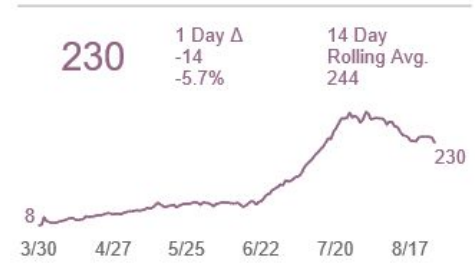

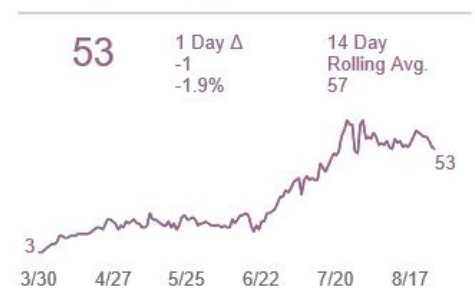

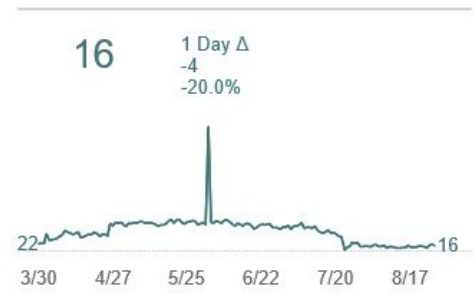

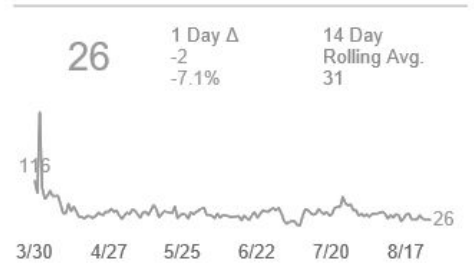
ICU Positive Patients



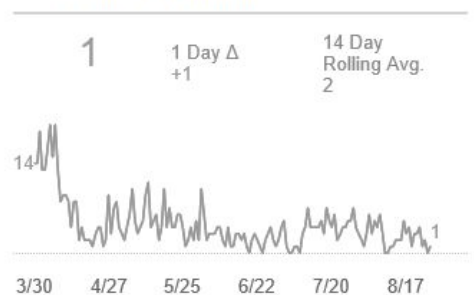
ICU Available Beds



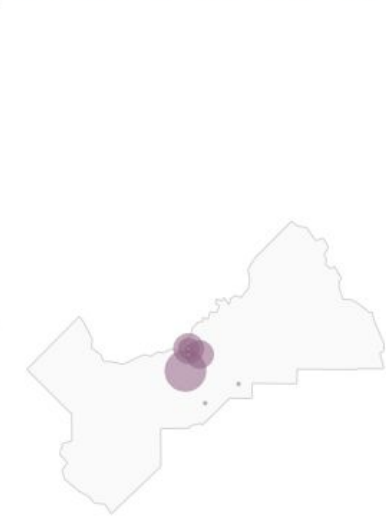
Suspected Patients

Department of Defense (DoD) Medical Support Teams

- Waiting for confirmation on extension through September 11.

Portverville Alternate Care Site (PACS)

- Only taking 10 patients maximum.
- Some medical staff were redeployed to help with fires.

CDC International Travel 14 Day Quarantine

- No longer a requirement
- You may feel well and not have any symptoms, but you can be contagious without symptoms and spread the virus to others. You and your travel companions (including [children](#)) pose a risk to your family, friends, and community for 14 days after you were exposed to the virus.

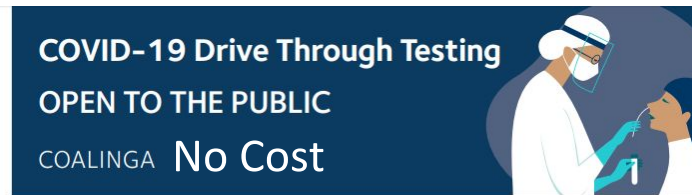

Saturday, August 29 | 8 – 10 a.m. | Coalinga Middle School, 265 Cambridge Ave.

How to sign up (choose one of the options that applies to you):

1. **Adventist Health patients:** Call any Adventist Health Medical Office and schedule a virtual visit to obtain a COVID-19 Testing Order. Arrive on designated testing date/time to be tested.
2. **Non-Adventist Health patients:** Contact your primary care provider to request a COVID-19 test. Have your provider call 559-935-4282 to schedule your appointment. Arrive on designated testing date/time to be tested.
3. Didn't sign up in time? No problem. Arrive at the testing date/time to be tested.

Day of event:

1. Arrive between 8 – 10 a.m. for testing.
2. Bring insurance card, if applicable.
3. Bring personal identification (driver's license, identification card, social security card or birth certificate).
4. Wear a mask.

What happens after testing?

- Your sample taken will be sent to Quest Diagnostics for processing. The ordering provider will receive the results within 7 – 14 days and will contact you with results.

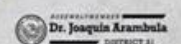

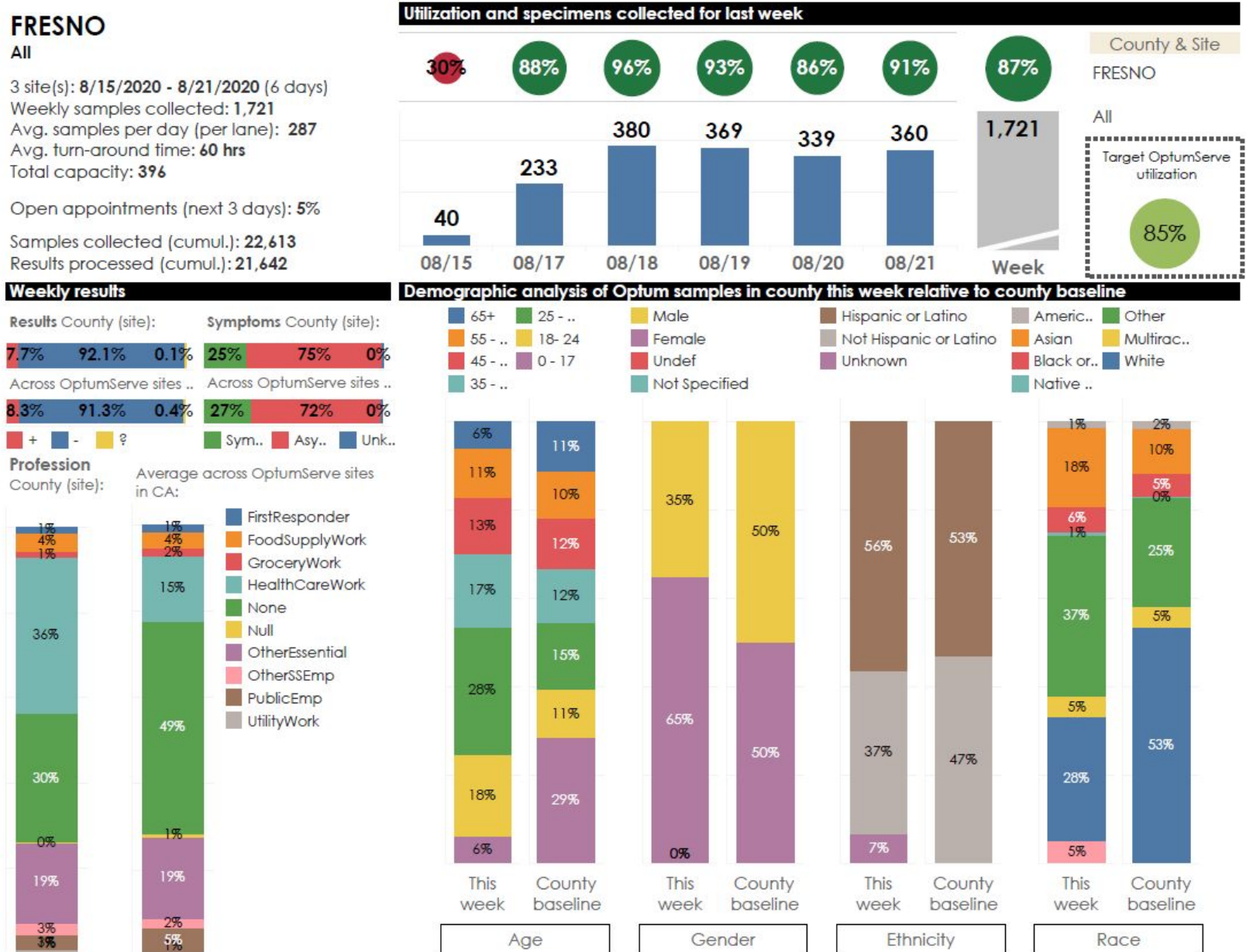

Testing Data from Optum Serve Sites.

- 8/15/2020-8/21/2020
- Utilization rates above 90% most days.
- Positivity rate is 7.7%
 - Most people going to Optum Serve sites are low-risk cases or asymptomatic (75%).
- **West Fresno Optum Serve location-**
Saturdays are light days. If people need a test on a Saturday, please encourage people to check availability here.



Health Department Messages

State mandates that children (Kindergarten and 7th grade) must receive immunizations before starting school.

- Vaccination rates continue to increase.

Flu immunizations

- Pharmacies have received their shipment to prepare for flu season. Get your flu shot sooner than later.
- The Department is planning vaccination event(s).

CELEBRATING SPECIAL EVENTS DURING COVID-19

Consider these reasons to postpone special events during this time.


- 1 SPECIAL EVENTS = PERSON TO PERSON CONTACT.**
Spread of the virus happens most frequently with close contacts. By hosting or attending a gathering, you're increasing everyone's risk of getting infected.
- 2 YOU'RE PUTTING LOVED ONES AT RISK!**
Your grandparents and family members with underlying health conditions are at a higher risk of contracting COVID-19. It's your responsibility to protect those at high risk.
- 3 BETTER TO BE SAFE THAN SORRY.**
People who look healthy still can be infected and can spread the virus to you and your household. That's why it's important to stay away from those outside your household, even if they don't seem sick.
- 4 HOUSEHOLD MEANS ONLY THOSE YOU LIVE WITH.**
Gatherings are limited to ONLY those you live with. Extended family or guests should not be allowed over for any occasion.

We all need to work together to do our part to stop the spread of COVID-19. "Shelter-in-Place" doesn't mean you can't stay connected with friends and family. Schedule phone calls or video chats to support one another, laugh together and to celebrate life's big moments during this time.

CBOs- Help us educate community about the importance of not gathering after religious ceremonies like baptisms, weddings, and funerals as well as birthdays.

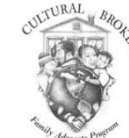

Summary

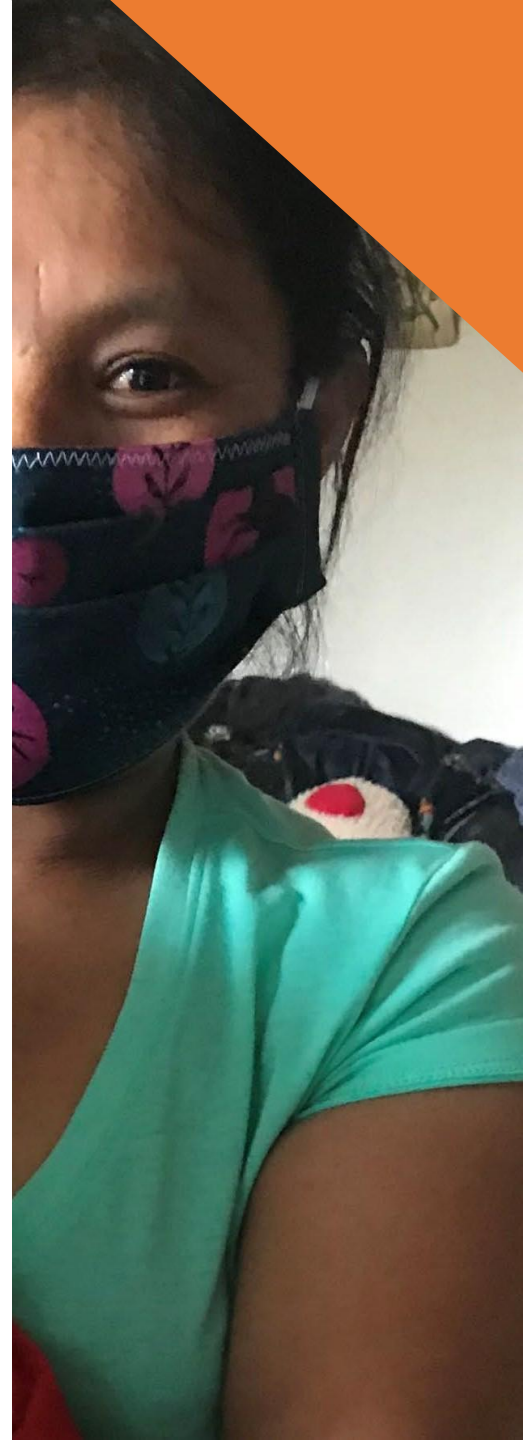
