



### **Health Department Updates**

#### **Department of Defense (DoD) Medical Support Teams**

- Waiting for confirmation on extension through September 11. Portverville Alternate Care Site (PACS)
- Only taking 10 patients maximum.
- Some medical staff were redeployed to help with fires.

#### **CDC International Travel 14 Day Quarantine**

- No longer a requirement
- You may feel well and not have any symptoms, but you can be contagious without symptoms and spread the virus to others. You and your travel companions (including <u>children</u>) pose a risk to your family, friends, and community for 14 days after you were exposed to the virus.

#### How to sign up (choose one of the options that applies to you):

- Adventist Health patients: Call any Adventist Health Medical Office and schedule a virtual visit to obtain a COVID-19 Testing Order. Arrive on designated testing date/time to be tested.
- Non-Adventist Health patients: Contact your primary care provider to request a COVID-19 test. Have your
  provider call 559-935-4282 to schedule your appointment. Arrive on designated testing date/time to be tested.
- 3. Didn't sign up in time? No problem. Arrive at the testing date/time to be tested

#### Day of event

201730 0820

- 1. Arrive between 8 10 a.m. for testing.
- 2. Bring insurance card, if applicable.
- 3. Bring personal identification (driver's license, identification card, social security card or birth certificate).
- 4. Wear a mask.

#### What happens after testing?

Your sample taken will be sent to Quest Diagnostics for processing. The ordering provider will receive the
results within 7 – 14 days and will contact you with results.





### **Health Department Messages**


# State mandates that children (Kindergarten and 7<sup>th</sup> grade) must receive immunizations before starting school.

## **Doing Public Health Different**

- The COVID-19 pandemic affects us all, but differently
- We are collaborating and working across sectors, races/ethnicities, languages, and cultures
- We believe communities have expertise that is vital to COVID-19 response
- We are committed to leveraging and bringing together all of our resources to slow the spread and help communities most affected to not only survive, but **thrive** during this time

## **Primary Project Components**

**Addressing COVID-19** with culturally appropriate approaches while employing local community leaders and building the needed public health infrastructure for today and the future.

### Health Education Curriculum & Adaptation

Culturally appropriate Community Health Worker curriculum developed by CVHPI and Fresno BHC covering public health principles, contact tracing, and education specific to COVID-19 response efforts covering food, shelter, financial assistance, mental health and immigration resources.

### Strategic Community-Led Prevention Efforts

Over 100 specialized Community Health Workers deployed throughout Fresno County, collective speaking at least 12 languages, to provide high volume health education, one-on-one and small group engagement, promote testing clinics and events, and coordinate efforts with institutional, labor, and medical partners.

#### Direct Quarantine Support

CHWs will connect & stay connected with community members who test COVID-19 positive and will coordinate direct financial support to enable community members to follow isolation guidelines to reduce COVID-19 transmission in the Central Valley.

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

A coordinated response to combat the COVID-19 outbreak among Fresno's most vulnerable populations.












